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2. Remedial coaching:

The Remedial coaching classes were conducted by the Department of Mathematics for slow learners in the UG program at S Ch V P M R Government Degree College, Ganapavaram. The program aimed to help students who were struggling to keep up with the pace of regular classes and improve their understanding of fundamental concepts in mathematics. Objectives: The primary objectives of the Remedial coaching classes were to improve the understanding of basic concepts, enhance problem-solving skills, and increase the

confidence of students who were struggling with mathematics. The program was also designed to help students catch up with their peers and excel in their coursework.

Methodology: The remedial coaching classes were conducted through interactive lectures, demonstrations, and hands-on exercises. The instructors used various teaching strategies, such as analogies, real-life examples to help students understand complex concepts. The instructors also provided one-on-one support to students who needed additional help.

Results: The remedial coaching classes were attended by a total of 19 students, and the program was conducted from 15-7-2019 to 24-8-2019. The results of the program were positive, with students showing significant improvements in their understanding of basic concepts in Mathematics. The students who participated in the program demonstrated better problem-solving skills and greater confidence in their ability to learn mathematics. Moreover, the attendance rate of the participants improved significantly compared to the regular classes.

Discussion: The results of the remedial coaching classes suggest that such programs can be effective in helping slow learners catch up with their peers and improve their academic performance. The interactive and hands-on approach of the program was particularly helpful in engaging students who were struggling with mathematics. However, future programs could be improved by incorporating more personalized learning strategies and by tailoring the program to meet the individual needs of each student.

Conclusion: The remedial coaching classes conducted by the Department of Mathematics for slow learners at S Ch V P M R Government Degree College, Ganapavaram were successful in achieving their objectives of helping students improve their understanding of basic concepts, enhancing problem-solving skills, and increasing their confidence. The program's results suggest that such initiatives can be beneficial for students who are struggling

academically, and further efforts should be made to develop and improve similar programs to support students in their learning journey.






3. Group discussion on relation between client and social worker I BA: 04-09-2019


FIELD VISIT to KRISHI VIGNAN KENDRA, UNDI ON 17.2.2020








2. Quiz:
