



REPORT OF THE WORKSHOP dated 14.08.2022

75 YEARS OF INDEPENDENCE

This offline workshop was organized on “75 Years of Independence” by the students themselves under the aegis of NSS Units in the College on the occasion of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. The workshop began with Vandemataram song followed by the President’s initial remarks on the event. The convener outlined the objectives of the workshop. The speeches of the Resource Persons followed. Towards the end of the program, about 10 students expressed their views on 75 years of independence while 72 students participated. The workshop began at 10.20 and concluded by 1.30 with the national anthem.

Introduction

'Har Ghar Tiranga' is a campaign under the aegis of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav to encourage people to bring the Tiranga home and to hoist it to mark the 75th year of India's independence.

Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav is an initiative of the Government of India to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of independence and the glorious history of India’s people, culture and achievements. The programme envisages inspiring Indians everywhere to hoist the national flag at their homes. The aim of the programme is to make the relationship with the national flag a more personal one rather than just keeping it formal or institutional.

The idea behind the initiative is to invoke the feeling of patriotism in the hearts of the people and promote awareness about tricolor. Earlier, Indian citizens were not allowed to hoist the National Flag except on selected occasions. This changed after a decade-long legal battle by industrialist Naveen Jindal culminated in the landmark SC judgment of January 23, 2004, that declared that the right to fly the National Flag freely with respect and dignity is a fundamental right of an Indian citizen within the meaning of Article 19(1) (a) of the Constitution of India.
