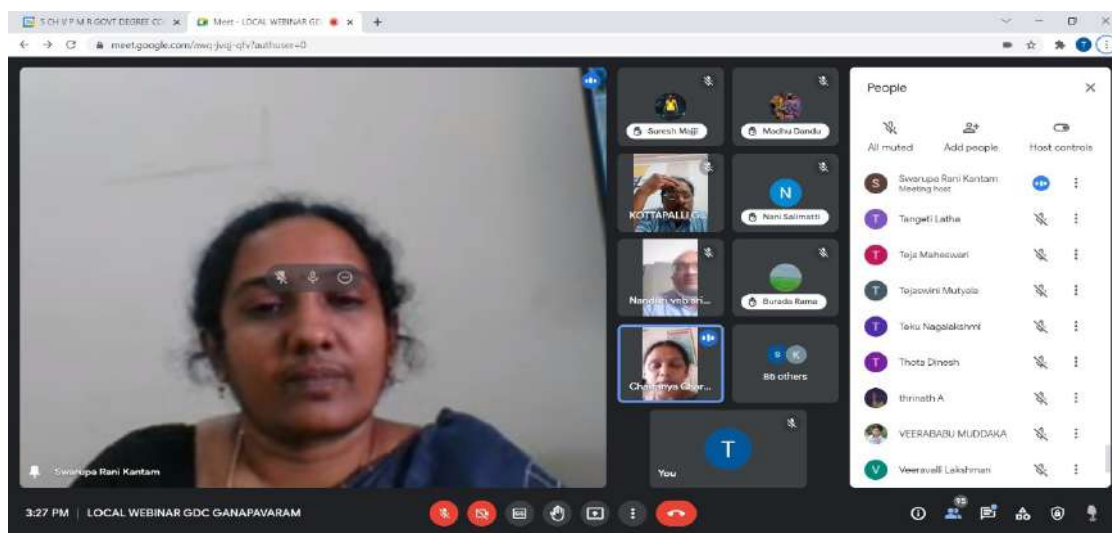

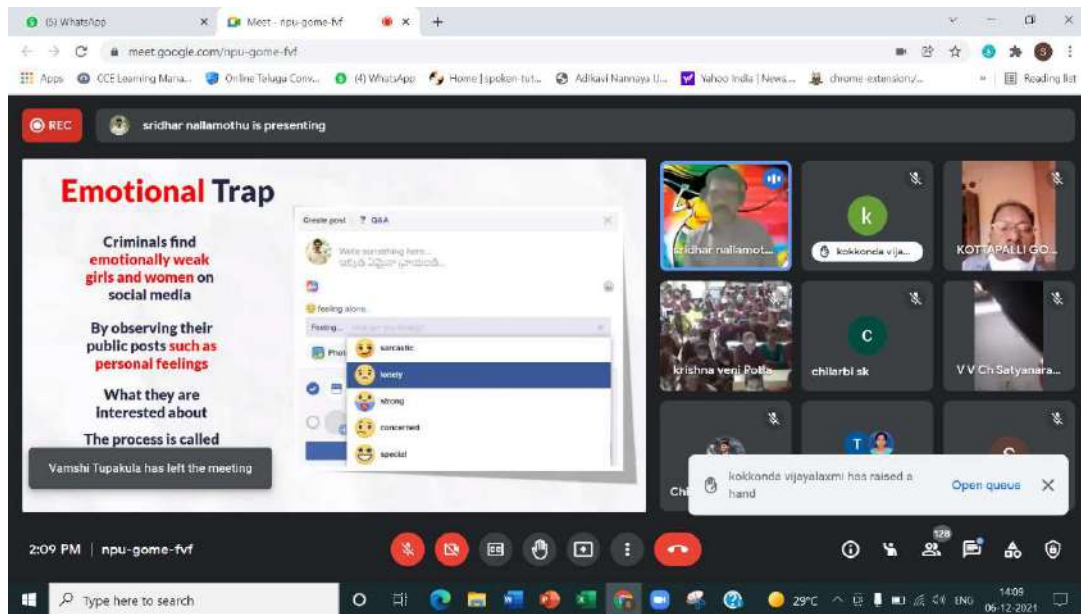
❖ Local Webinar on 25.11.2021

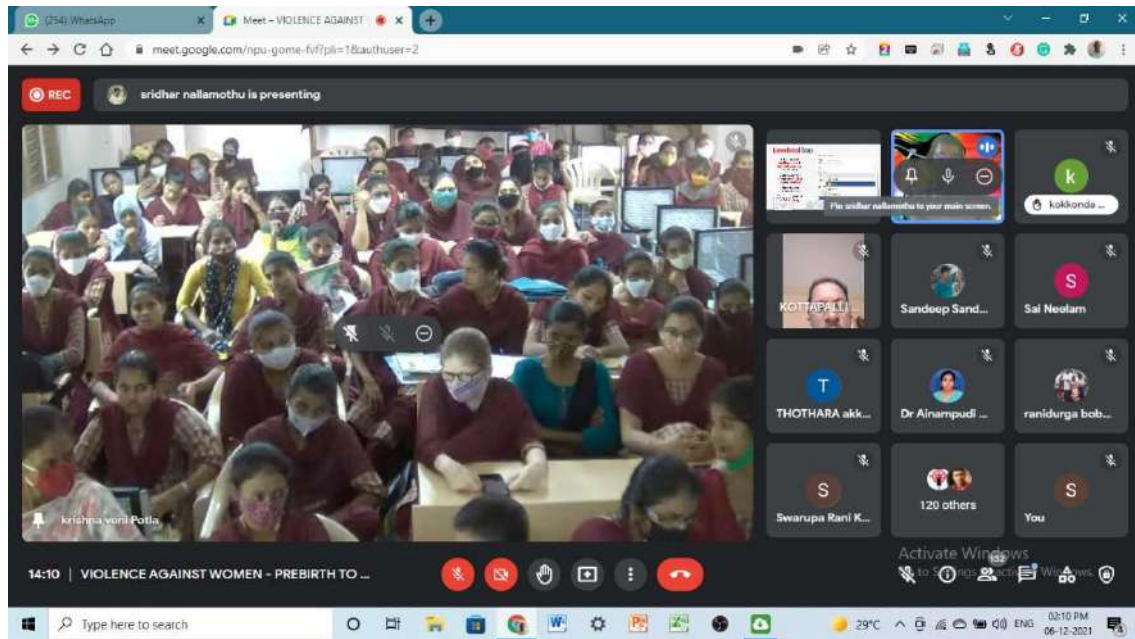

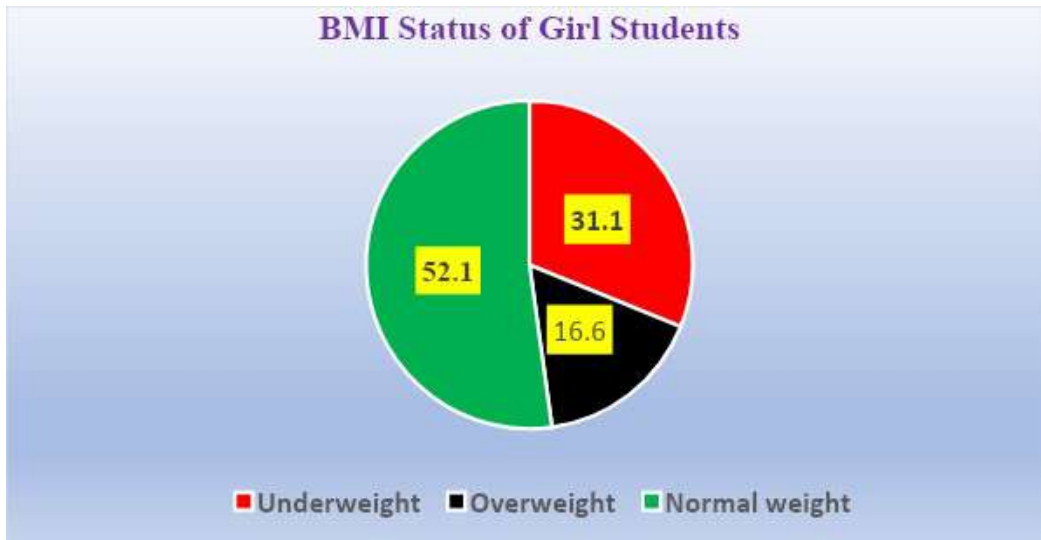

❖ Awareness Program on Women Health and Hygiene on 17.02.2022

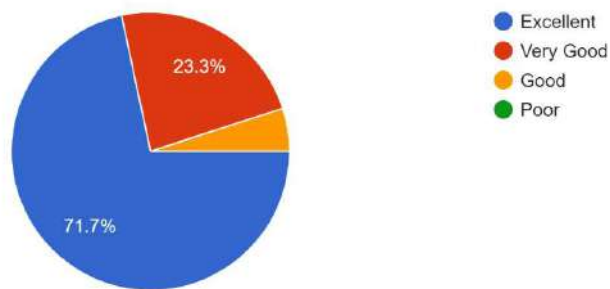

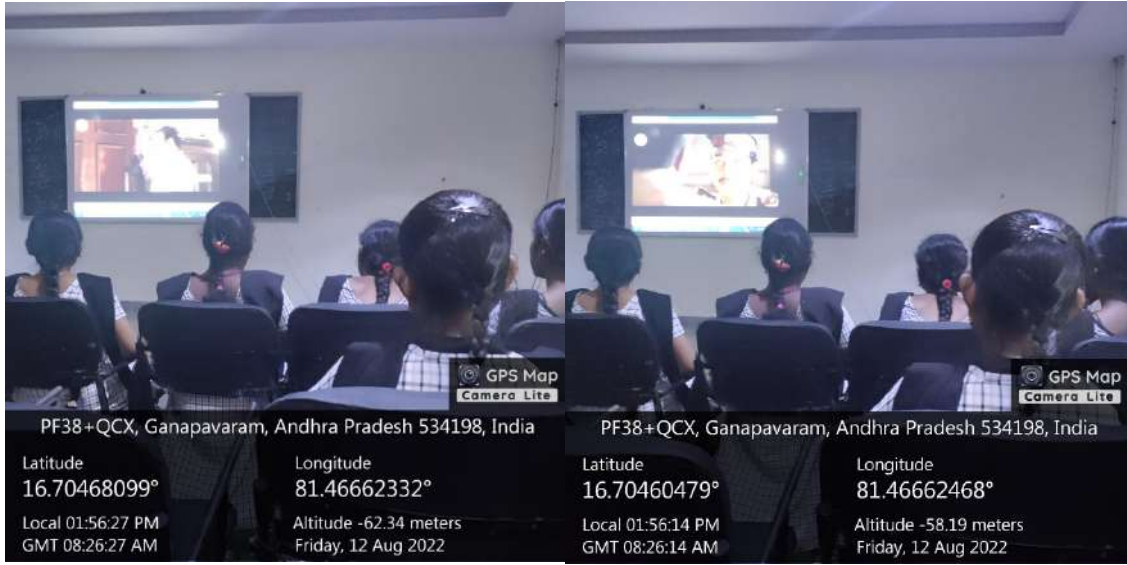
❖ Screening a Movie on 16.07.2022

4. Constraints & Limitations:

Society is transforming at a rapid pace and social workers must do the same to provide the best support to their clients. Social work professionals are introduced to cases centred on **violence, substance abuse, isolation, inequality** and more. With experienced, proper training and a **positive mindset**, social workers across the nation have developed strategies for addressing these issues, but many challenges remain.

5. Evidence of Success

Evidence-based social work uses the most advanced evidence to inform practice, while also integrating practitioners' clinical expertise with patients' values and preferences. Working within this scientific framework can help social workers determine what works, in what circumstances and for whom—a process that allows social workers to serve their clients effectively.

Research also consistently shows that some people experiencing serious mental illness may respond well to assertive community treatment, a highly specialized approach that integrates several disciplines and delivers care in home in a community setting like a park.

The purpose of the World Programme of Action concerning Disabled Persons is to promote effective measures for prevention of disability, rehabilitation and the realization of the goals of "full participation" of disabled persons in social life and development, and of "equality.

B) Principles or Concepts:

Prevention: means measures aimed at preventing the onset of mental, physical and sensory impairments

Rehabilitation: means a goal-oriented and time-limited process aimed at enabling an impaired person to reach an optimum mental, physical and/or social functional level.

Equalization of opportunities : the process through which the general system of society, such as the physical and cultural environment, housing and transportation, social and health services, educational and work opportunities, cultural and social life, including sports and recreational facilities, are made accessible to all.

3. The Context:

Impairment: Any loss or abnormality of psychological, physiological, or anatomical structure or function.

Disability: Any restriction or lack of ability to perform an activity in the manner or within the range considered normal for a human being.

Handicap: A disadvantage for a given individual, resulting from an impairment or disability, that limits or prevents the fulfilment of a role that is normal, depending on age, sex, social and cultural factors, for that individual.

The Practice:

Through our '**Enabling the disabled**' we are planning to do one social service activity per month. In this part we find the disabled people who have not any support from their family members and orphans and serve worth **Rs.500/-** Provisions for them.

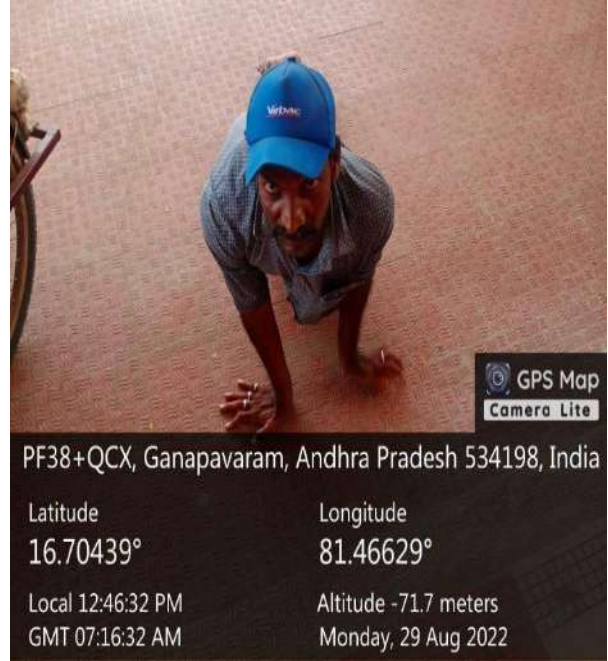

2. Goals

A) Aims & Objectives

B) Principles or Concepts

- ♣ To inculcate interest in the subject by making it easy to understand for both average and below average students.

3. The Context

Chemistry sometimes is called the "central science" because it connects other sciences to each other, such as biology, physics, geology, and environmental science. Majority of the students are facing difficulty in learning chemistry in lower classes. Basic knowledge of chemistry helps us to understand and analyze the events occurring in daily life. Also in depth knowledge helps the students to prepare for higher studies.

4. The Practice

Some important and basic chemical concepts are explained in detail to students. This is practiced thrice a week not more than 30 minutes per session. After every concept students are encouraged to solve objective based questions or problems.

Constraints & Limitations:

Some students took time to turn up for the class due to fear of the subject.

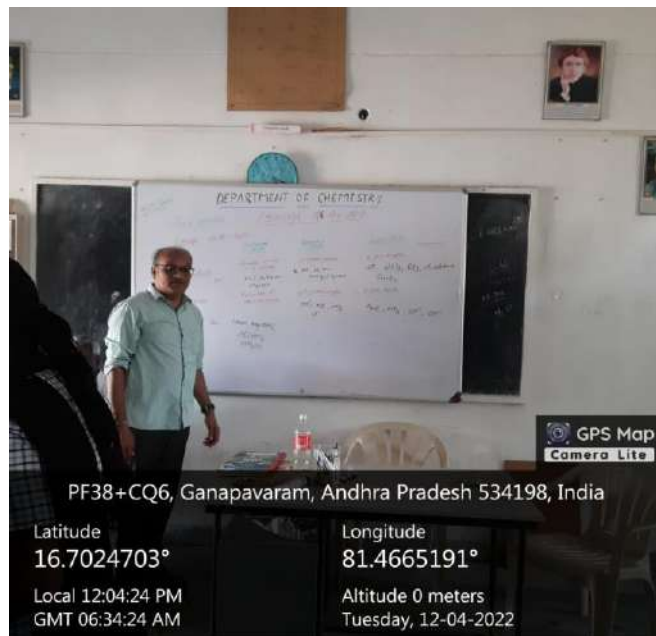
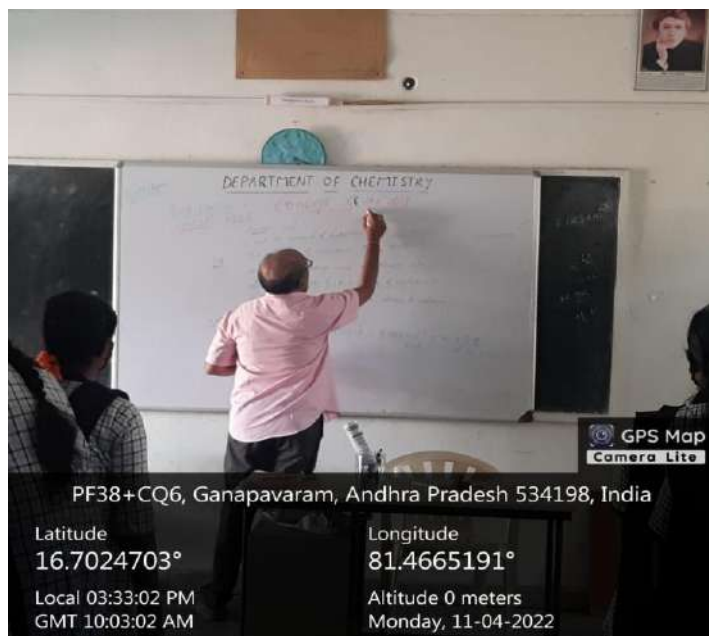
5. Evidence of Success

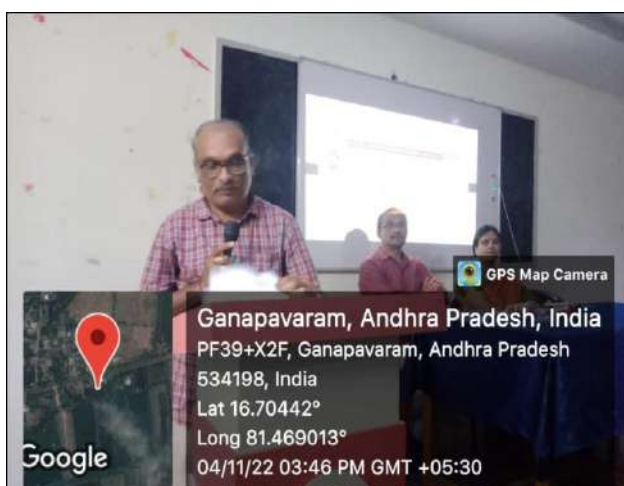
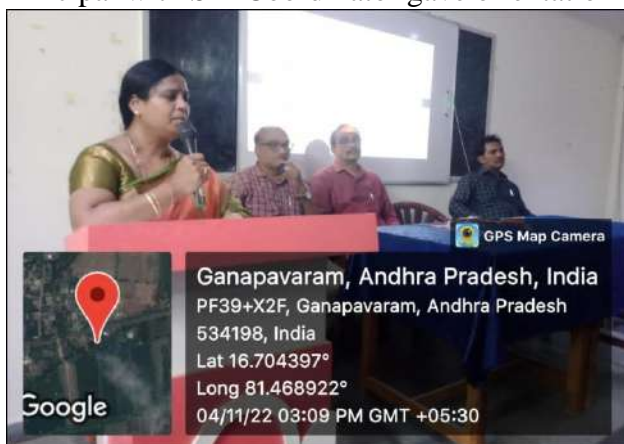
Outcomes of the SIP Program:

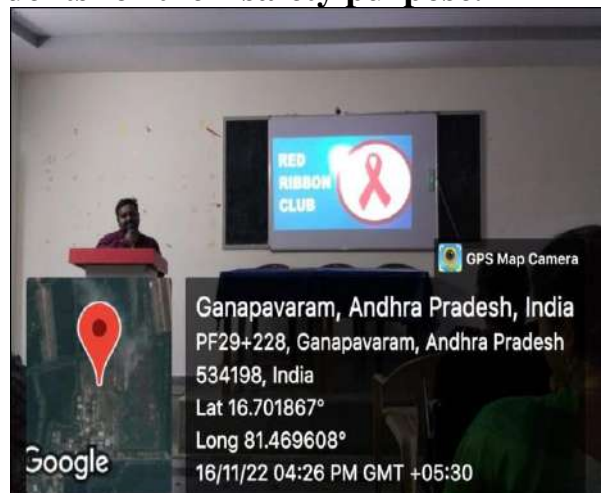
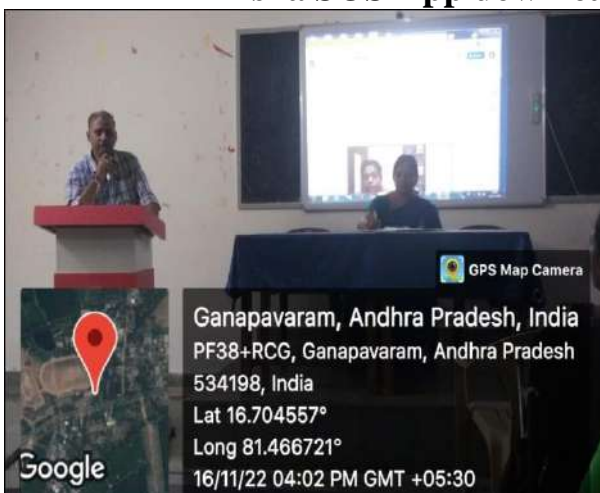

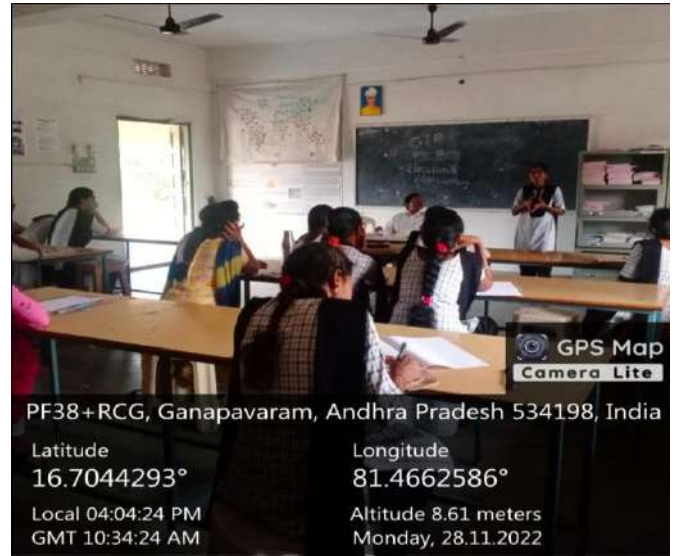
