### 1. Title of the Practice:

**Non Academic: Enabling the Disabled (SOCIAL SERVICE ACTIVITY)**

### 2. Goals:

#### A) Aims & Objectives:

The purpose of the World Programme of Action concerning Disabled Persons is to promote effective measures for prevention of disability, rehabilitation and the realization of the goals of "full participation" of disabled persons in social life and development, and of "equality.

#### B) Principles or Concepts:

**Prevention:** means measures aimed at preventing the onset of mental, physical and sensory impairments

**Rehabilitation:** means a goal-oriented and time-limited process aimed at enabling an impaired person to reach an optimum mental, physical and/or social functional level.

**Equalization of opportunities :** the process through which the general system of society, such as the physical and cultural environment, housing and transportation, social and health services, educational and work opportunities, cultural and social life, including sports and recreational facilities, are made accessible to all.

### 3. The Context:

**Impairment:** Any loss or abnormality of psychological, physiological, or anatomical structure or function.

**Disability:** Any restriction or lack of ability to perform an activity in the manner or within the range considered normal for a human being.

**Handicap:** A disadvantage for a given individual, resulting from an impairment or disability, that limits or prevents the fulfilment of a role that is normal, depending on age, sex, social and cultural factors, for that individual.

### The Practice:

Through our '**Enabling the disabled**' we are planning to do one social service activity per month. In this part we find the disabled people who have not any support from their family members and orphans and serve worth **Rs.500/-** Provisions for them.

### 4. Constraints & Limitations:

Sometimes students may not have interest to do this activity. They may not have money. From other side the person who received the help from the college students will feel ashamed. Some disabled people will simply reject and rudely can say that we don't want anyone's help.

### 5. Evidence of Success

'**Enabling the disabled**' students happily offered their pocket money to do the social service. It's an encouragement for others to do so. I myself as a teacher will add **200/-** per month.

### 6. Problems Encountered & Resources Required:

Second Extension Activity is not only purely based on the Expensiveness, but also dependency. Finding a suitable disabled person is a major problem. Collection of money from the students is an another issue. But our level best we found the person and doing one activity per month worth **Rs.500/-**.

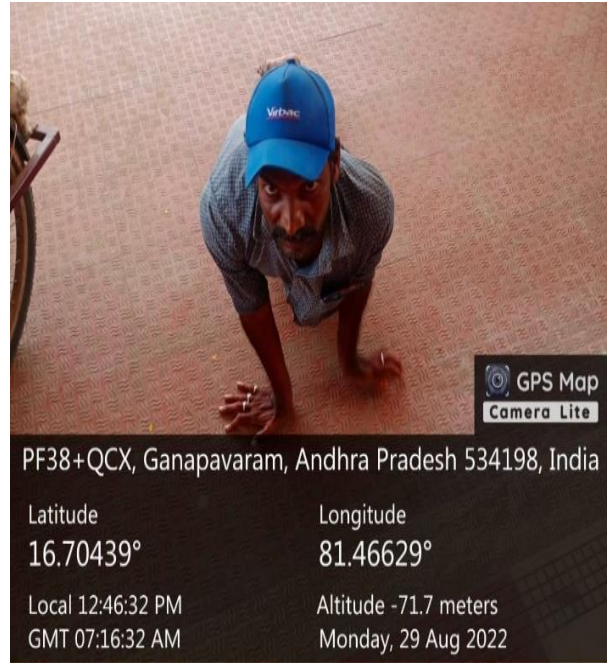
