Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted online and students' feedback on curriculum and college was taken online in the months of April and May 2022 at the end of the Odd Semester for all 3 years of students.

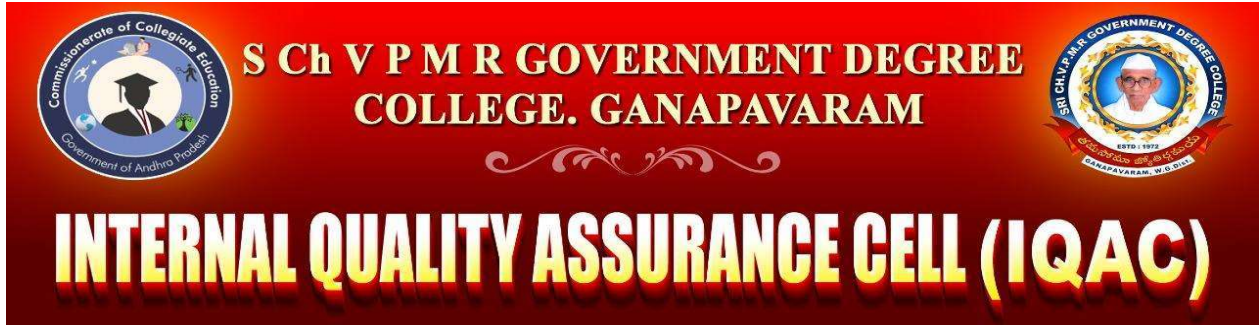
The report was placed before the College Planning and Development Council (CPDC) on 13.06.22 and 28.09.22. As per the resolutions taken in the CPDC meeting, the measures (action) taken are as mentioned below.

- Wifi facility was reestablished and shared to all.
- **Mandal Level Selections for CM CUP Tourney**, (a sports festival from Dussehra to Ugadi) - organized by CULTURAL & SPORTS COMMITTEE of the College in association with **Sports Authority of Andhra Pradesh (SAAP) on 6.11.21.**
- **Block Level sports meet** - organized by CULTURAL & SPORTS COMMITTEE of the College in association with **Nehru Yuva kendra**, Ministry of Youth Affairs, Govt. of India on 23.12.21
- **Sankranthi Sambaraalu** - Traditional Cultural competitions -organized by Women Empowerment Cell in the first week of January 2022.
- The lecturers were urged to conduct more activities focused on improving students' communication skills and removing stage fear.
- At the behest of the Principal, the percentage of ICT-enabled classes was improved.
- New Gents toilet block is proposed under RUSA 2-crore grant.
- Besides the existing certificate course on computer skills, a second certificate course on computer skills was initiated exclusively for non-computer students in August 2022.
- Across all programs, many field trips were organized by Botany, Zoology, Social Work etc., departments.
- Two new computer labs with 50 brand new computers with the latest configuration were established in the 2nd floor of the college building, and they were put to the optimum use.

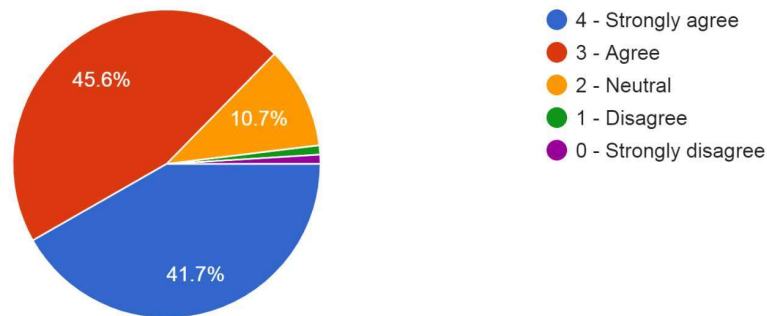
FEEDBACK REPORT 2021-22

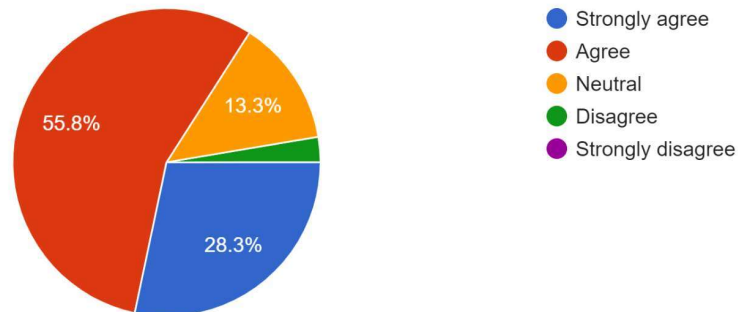


2. Students' Feedback on Curriculum & College at the end of Odd semester

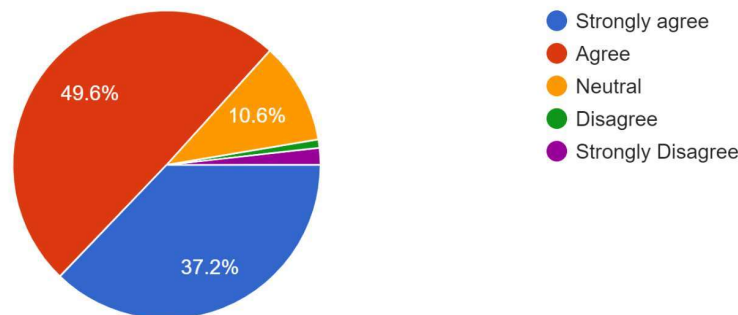
Overall curriculum structure is good

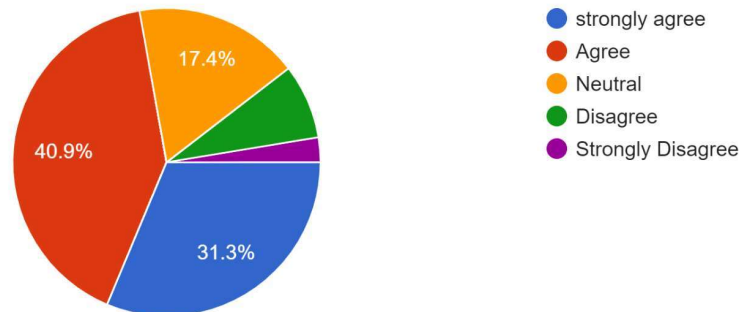
The feedback was placed before the College Planning and Development Council on 13.06.22 and discussed the measures to be taken.

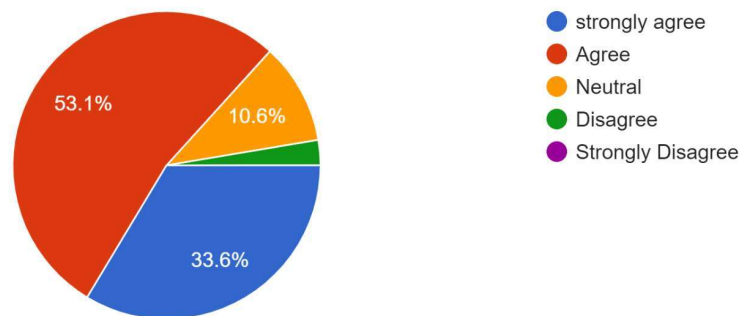


3. Parents Feedback on Curriculum & College at year end

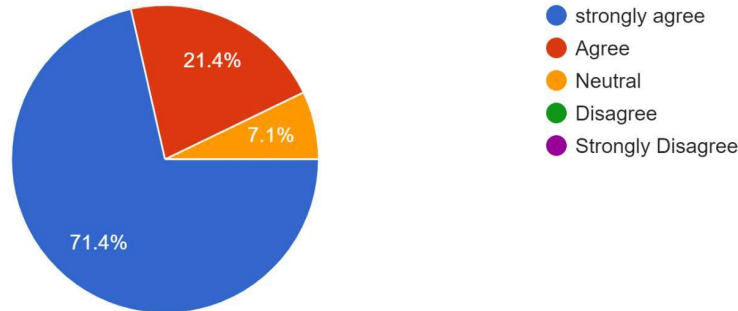


5. Teachers' Feedback

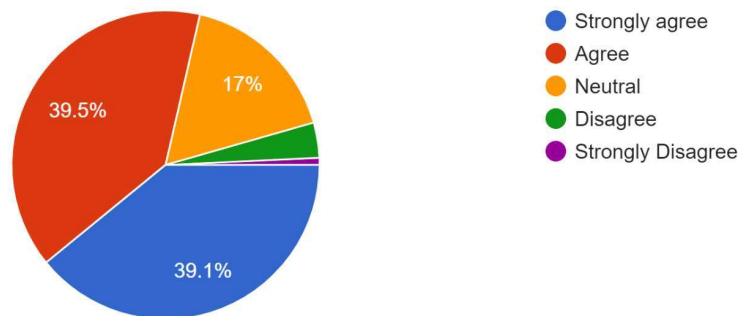


6. Students' Feedback on Curriculum & College at year end

views through this Google form for SSS. However, they mentioned certain issues to be addressed which are mentioned in a consolidated list below.


8. Feedback on Faculty at year-end
