

This overarching goal encompasses several key objectives, including the consolidation of infrastructure across various sectors, the expansion of social welfare schemes to ensure the well-being of all citizens, the acceleration of economic growth to create opportunities and prosperity, the promotion of sustainable development practices to protect the environment, and the enhancement of both the ease of living for individuals and the ease of doing business for enterprises. Furthermore, the vision sets specific targets such as achieving "zero poverty," ensuring 100% good quality school education for all, providing access to high-quality and affordable healthcare, attaining 100% skilled labor with meaningful employment, increasing women's participation in economic activities to 70%, and empowering farmers to make India the 'food basket of the world'.
