Preface

On behalf of the staff and students of S.Ch.V.P.M.R. Government Degree College, Ganapavaram, I am honored to present the Annual Report for the academic year 2025–26, highlighting the major events, achievements, and activities of the institution on the occasion of the Annual Day–cum–Farewell Day held on 18th March 2026.

The college was founded in 1972 by Sri Chintalapati Vara Prasada Murthy Raju, a renowned Gandhian philosopher and former Minister of Andhra Pradesh, who dedicated his life to social service and educational development. Murthy Raju garu established 68 educational institutions in rural and backward areas, with a strong emphasis on promoting education for girls. Demonstrating his commitment to social progress, he generously donated nearly 1,800 acres of land for educational and community development.

The institution is affiliated with Adikavi Nannaya University, Rajamahendravaram. At its inception, the college offered B.A. and B.Com. programmes, and later expanded its academic profile with the introduction of B.Sc. programmes in 1975, Computer Science in 2001, and B.Com. (Computer Applications) in 2008. Over the years, the college has steadily grown in academic strength and infrastructure while remaining committed to its mission of empowering students through the right education for a better future.

Progress and Implementation of Single Major Degree Programme under NEP 2020

In alignment with the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the revised curriculum framework introduced by APSCHE from the academic year 2025–26, our college has continued the effective implementation of the Single Major Degree Programme with significant academic enhancements. The revised curriculum emphasizes flexibility, multidisciplinary learning, skill orientation, and experiential education to meet contemporary academic and industry requirements.

As part of the curricular revisions, Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) have been strengthened with the introduction of Artificial Intelligence-based courses, including *Introduction to Artificial Intelligence* and *Applications of Artificial Intelligence*, enabling students to acquire emerging technological competencies alongside their core discipline knowledge. The curriculum also incorporates Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) courses to promote awareness of India's rich intellectual traditions and value-based education.

Enrollment Report 2025–26: Programme-wise Student Strength

During the academic year 2025–26, the first-year student enrolment was 77 students (23 male and 54 female) against a total intake of 280 seats, resulting in an overall seat utilization of 28%, with the highest enrolment observed in B.Sc (Hons) Computer Science (60%) followed by B.Com (Hons) Computer Applications (45%).

The total sanctioned intake of the college for the academic year 2025–26 was 720, out of which 267 students were enrolled, resulting in an overall enrollment ratio of 37%.

The student population comprised 96 male students and 171 female students, with female students constituting 64% of total enrollment, reflecting strong participation of women in higher education.

Year-wise distribution shows:

- I Year: 77 students
 - II Year: 112 students
 - III Year: 78 students
- indicating comparatively lower fresh admissions during the academic year.

Stream-wise enrollment trends reveal that:

- B.Sc programmes account for 44.6% of total enrollment.
- B.Com programmes contribute 43.8%.
- B.A programmes constitute 11.6%, indicating relatively lower preference for humanities streams.

Programme-wise analysis indicates highest enrollment in:

- B.Com (Honours) Computer Applications – 44% of total students.
 - B.Sc (Honours) Computer Science – 27% of total students.
- showing a clear student inclination towards technology-oriented and employability-driven programmes.

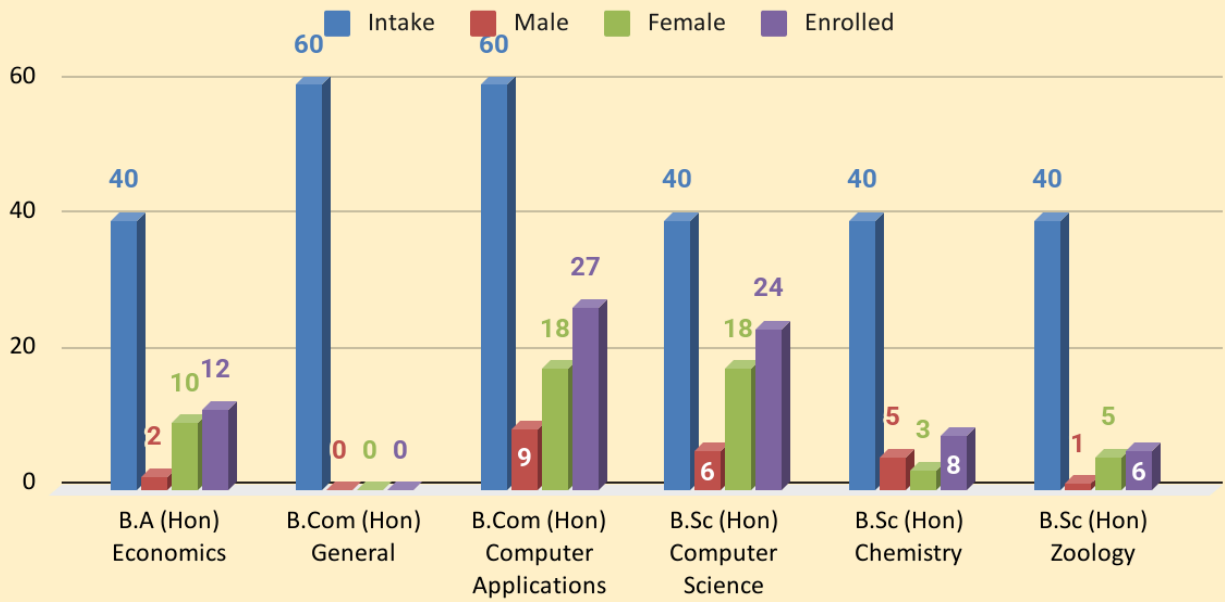
Female enrollment is dominant across all streams and social categories, especially in science programmes, highlighting the institution's success in promoting gender equity and STEM participation.

The enrollment pattern reflects the growing preference for skill-oriented, multidisciplinary, and NEP-aligned Single Major Honours programmes.

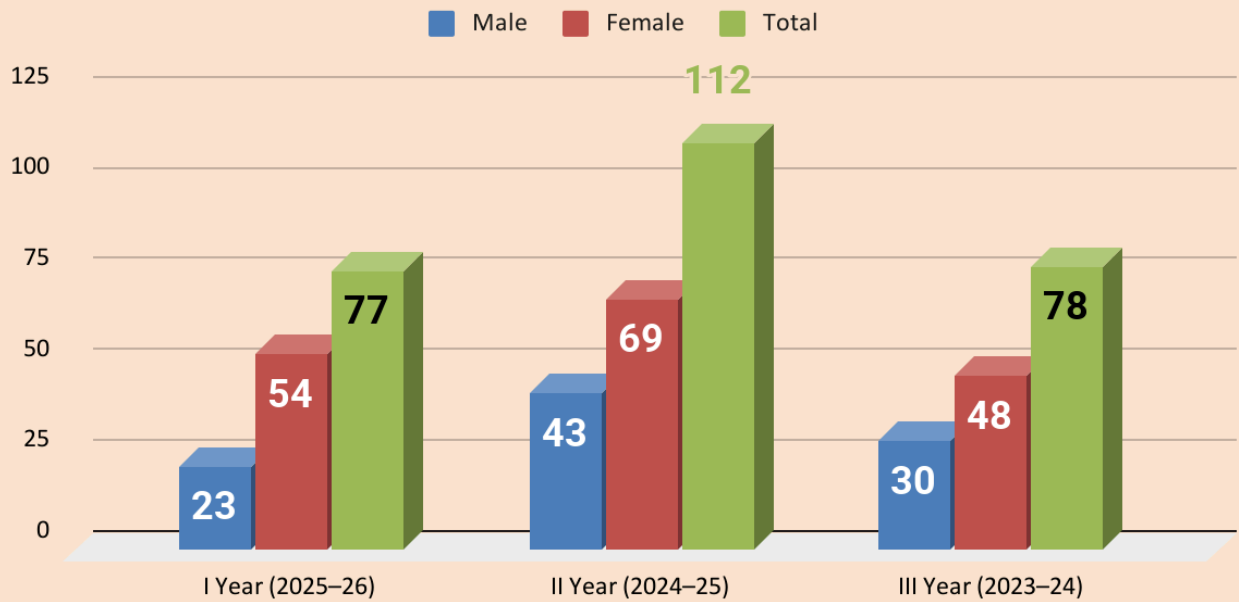

Admissions 2025-26

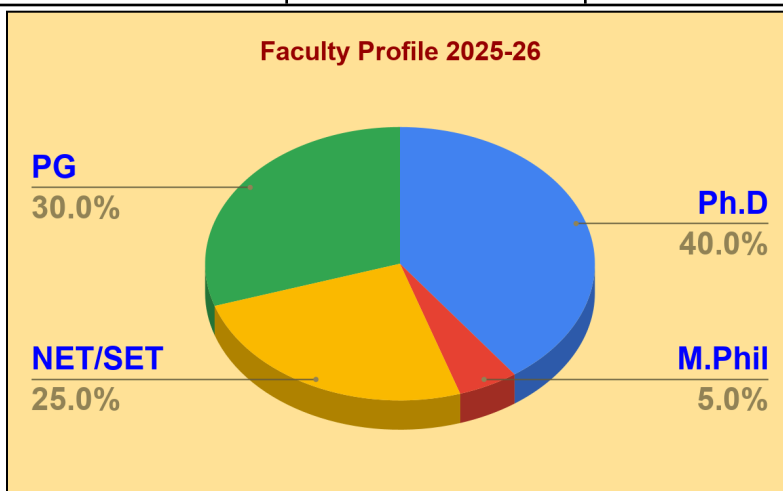


Yearwise Enrollment 2025-26

Academic Performance 2024-25

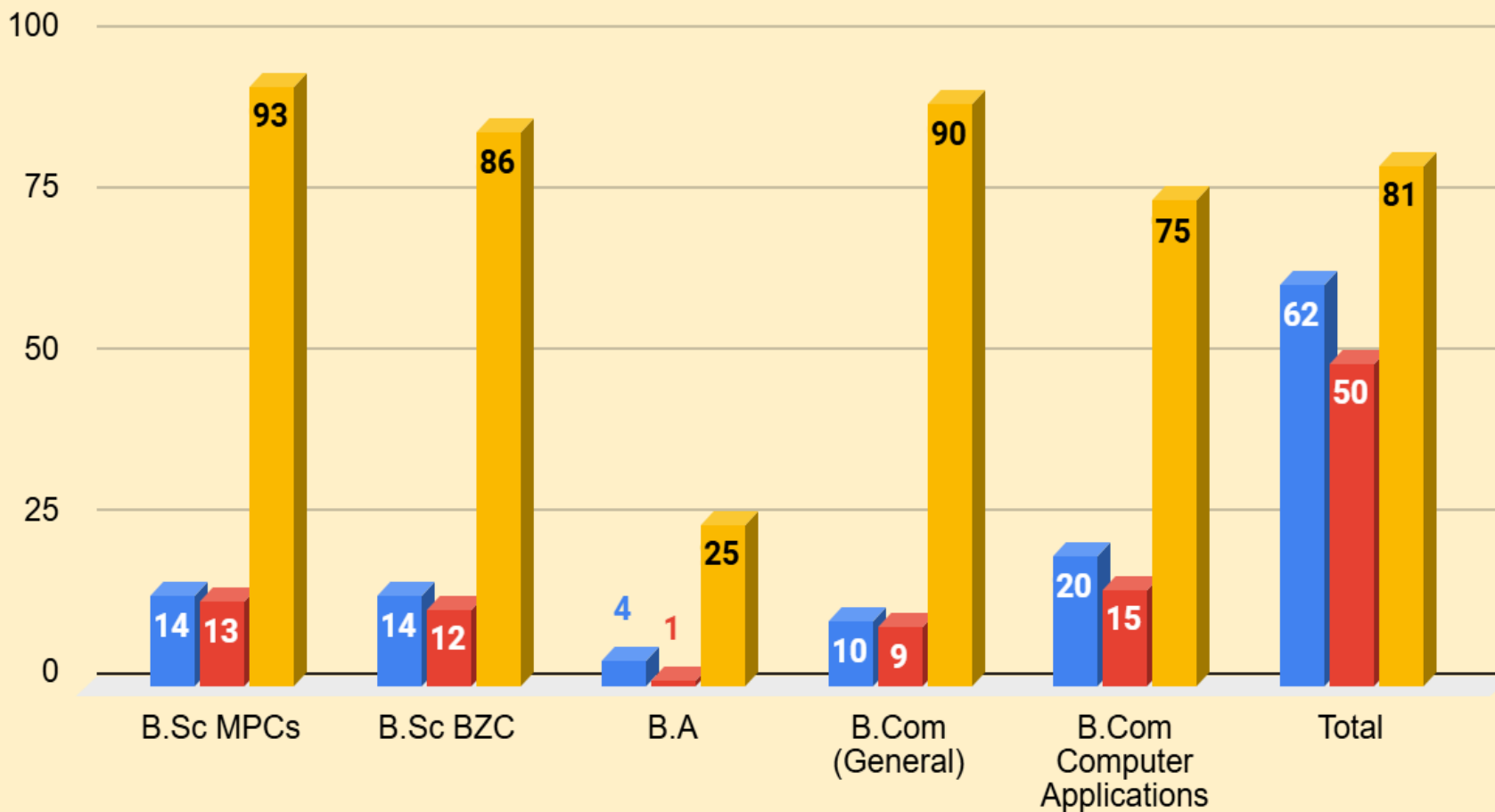

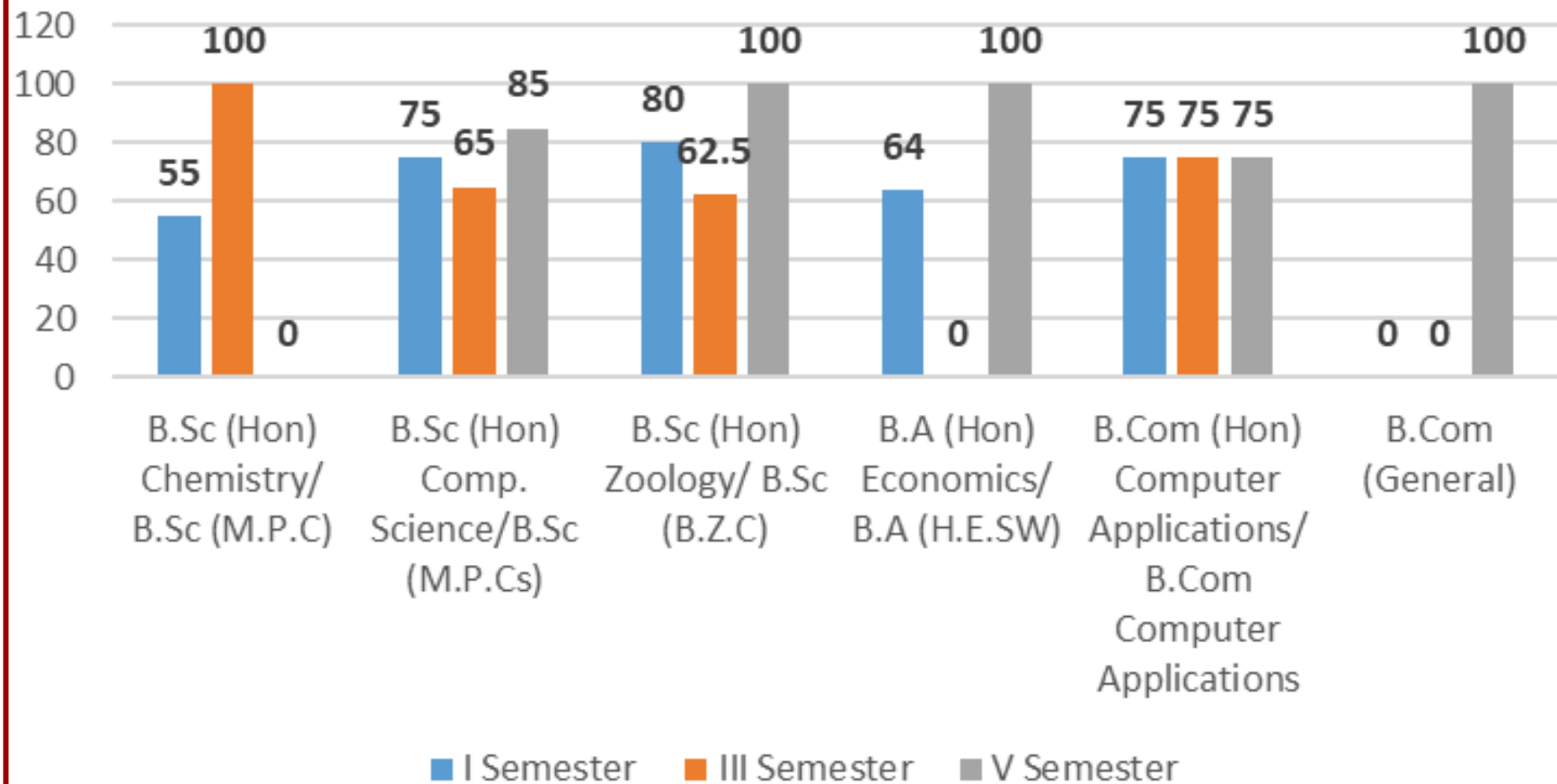

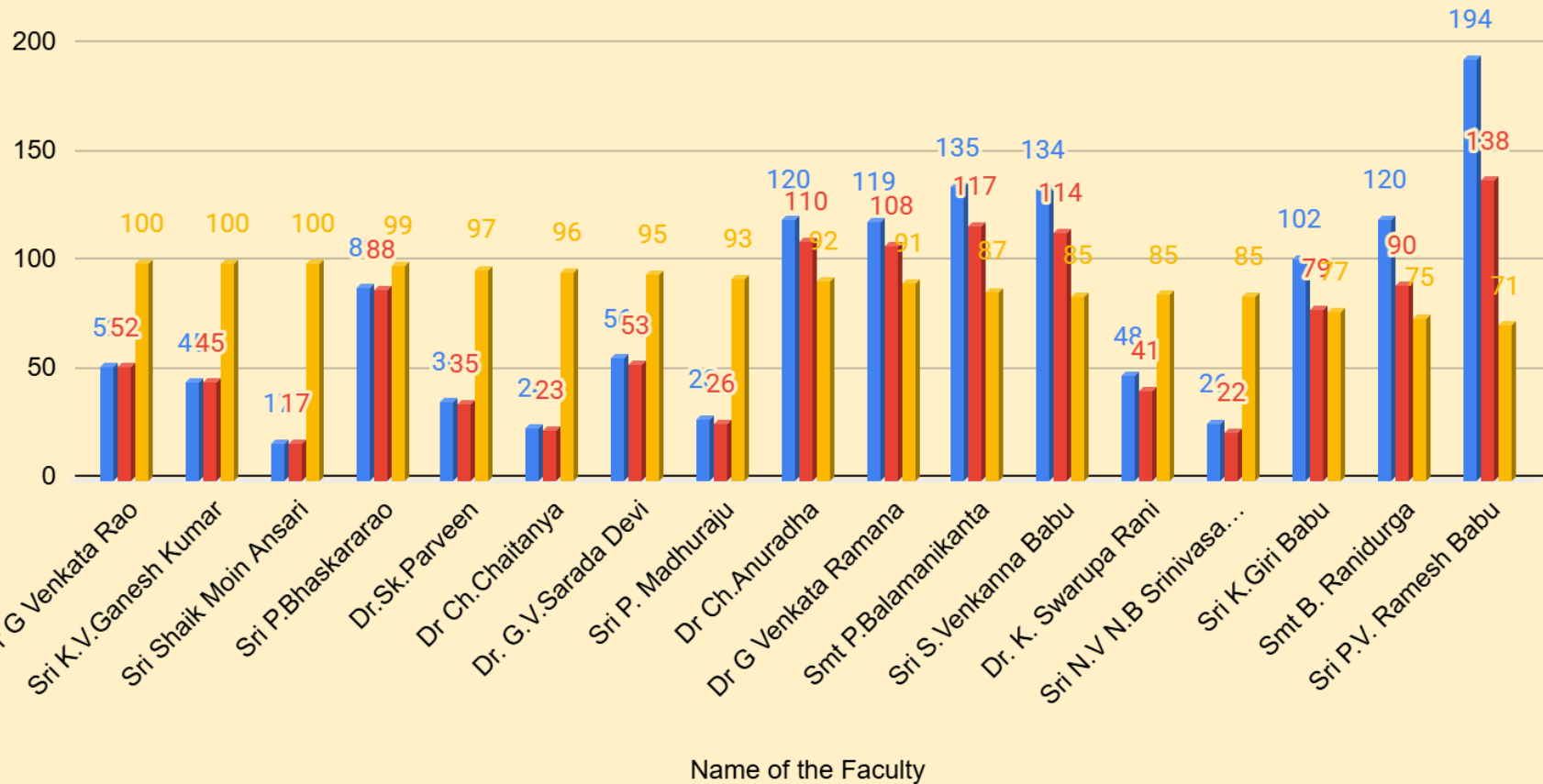

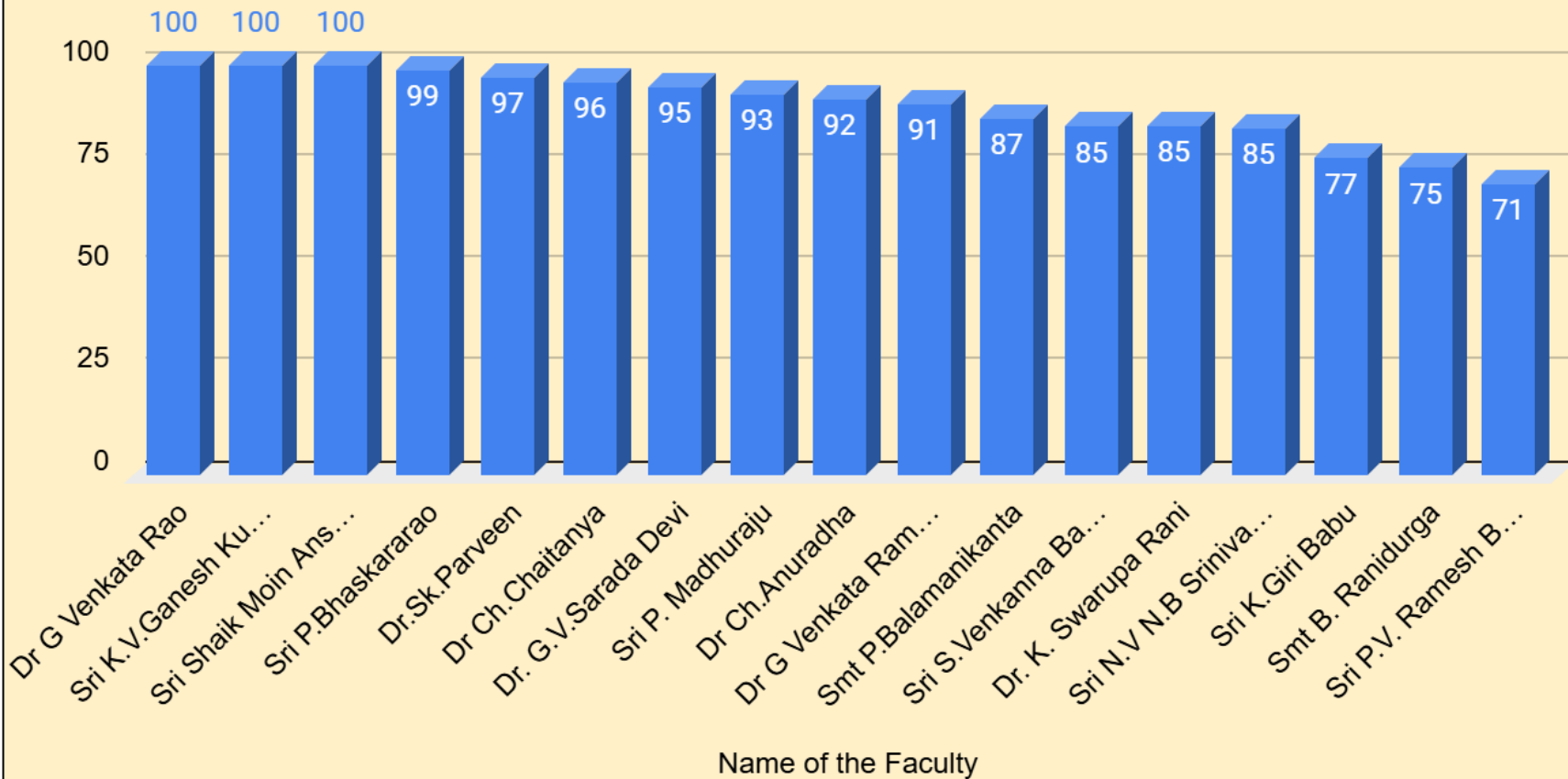

Empowering Growth: Financial Assistance and Infrastructure Development

- RUSA 2.0 infrastructure grant of Rs.2.00 Crores was sanctioned to the college as per Proc.Rc.No.42-II/SPD/RUSA/AO/2018 dated 22-07-2020 of the State Project Director, RUSA, Government of Andhra Pradesh. As per the sanction, Rs.60.00 Lakhs was earmarked for procurement of equipment and Rs.1.40 Crores for civil works.
- The civil works component, entrusted to APEWIDC, includes construction of additional classrooms and renovation/upgradation of existing infrastructure in the college. The work is currently in progress with about 70% completion, and Rs.51,30,817 has been spent so far towards civil works.
- Under the Equipment component of RUSA, purchases were made in accordance with the prescribed guidelines to strengthen institutional facilities. As part of this, in the Academic Year 2025-26 chairs worth ₹1,97,250 were procured on 28-03-2025 to improve seating arrangements in classrooms and seminar halls, thereby supporting academic activities and student comfort. The college is regularly coordinating with the Executive Engineer and Assistant Engineer of APEWIDC, West Godavari, to monitor the progress of RUSA works and ensure their timely completion.
- Under the RUSA infrastructure development initiative, protective grills for the ground-floor college building, along with approved gates, were successfully installed as per the sanctioned DPR under the monitoring of the PMU, RUSA. The completed work significantly strengthened campus infrastructure by enhancing building safety, security, and asset protection.
- The college purchased library books worth ₹40,000 for PG entrance coaching, based on departmental recommendations, to support final-year students preparing for postgraduate entrance examinations and competitive tests.

Campus Recruitment and Training Activities – 2025–26

During the academic year 2025–26, the Jawahar Knowledge Centre (JKC) of S.Ch.V.P.M.R. Government Degree College, Ganapavaram actively worked towards enhancing students' employability by providing skill training and campus recruitment opportunities. In total, 65 students were trained under JKC programmes in areas such as communication skills, aptitude, interview techniques, and workplace readiness to prepare them for employment opportunities. The placement and training activities were effectively coordinated by JKC Full-Time Mentor Sri I.V.L.R.K. Prasad and Placement Officer Dr. G. Venkata Ramana, Lecturer in Telugu, who worked towards enhancing students' employability and career opportunities. As part of the placement initiatives, the college successfully organized two campus recruitment drives during the year, attracting several companies from different sectors.

The first Campus Job Drive was conducted on 11 September 2025, in which three companies participated. Apollo Pharmacy offered 50 vacancies, including 15 Pharmacist positions, 15 Pharmacy Assistant positions, and 20 Retail Trainee Assistant positions. Paytm offered 35 positions for Sales Executives, while the BTS Group of Companies offered 20 vacancies, including 10 Tele Caller positions and 10 Public Relations Officer (PRO) positions. Altogether, these companies offered 105 job opportunities. In this recruitment drive, 34 candidates attended the selection process, 25 candidates were shortlisted, and 11 candidates were successfully selected for employment.

The second Campus Recruitment Drive was organized on 26 February 2026, with the participation of four companies – ZEAL (Chennai), Paytm, Deccan Chemicals, and 2050 Health Care. This drive received a good response from students. A total of 45 candidates attended the recruitment process, 31 candidates were shortlisted, and 21 candidates were selected for various positions. Offer letters were issued to the selected candidates by the participating companies.


Overall, during the academic year 2025–26, the college conducted two campus recruitment drives with the participation of seven companies. Seventy-nine candidates attended the drives, 56 were shortlisted, and 32 students secured placements, reflecting the college's continued commitment to skill development, career guidance, and improving employability among rural youth.

Charting Futures: Student Progression

During the academic year 2025-26, the college recorded encouraging progress in campus placements. Six companies visited the campus, and a total of 32 students were placed, including 28 students from our college and 4 students from other colleges.

Coming to progression to higher education, several students of the college have applied for APPGCET-2026 to pursue postgraduate studies in subjects such as Chemistry, Computer Science, Botany, Zoology, Physics, and Commerce. The students are actively preparing for the entrance examination with the aim of securing good ranks and gaining admission into reputed universities and postgraduate programmes. The college wishes them all the very best in their academic pursuits and future careers.

A remarkable achievement was secured by M. Krishna Priya (III B.Sc Zoology), who attained the 3rd rank in APPGCET-2024, highlighting the high caliber and dedication of our students.

Bridging Academia and Industry: Internships for Skill Development

During the academic year 2025–26, the VI Semester Internship was implemented as part of the curriculum under the Honours Degree Programme, providing practical exposure and industry-oriented learning to students. The internship programme was coordinated by Dr. G. V. Sarada Devi, Lecturer in Mathematics, Internship Coordinator, who facilitated the smooth implementation of the internship activities.

A total of 78 students from different programmes successfully completed online internships conducted by OTP Technologies Private Limited. These internships helped students gain practical knowledge in emerging technological and professional fields.

The internship courses offered were as follows:

- Machine Learning Using Python – completed by 24 students of B.Sc. Computer Science, guided by the Department of Computer Science.
- Machine Learning Using Python – completed by 39 students of B.Com. Computer Applications, under the guidance of the Department of Commerce.
- Medical Coding – completed by 6 students of B.Sc. Zoology, under the supervision of Dr. Sk. Parveen, Lecturer in Zoology (Contract).
- Molecular Docking – completed by 9 students of B.Sc. Chemistry, under the guidance of Sri Sk. Moin Ansari, Lecturer in Chemistry.

These internships significantly enhanced students' technical skills, industry awareness, and practical understanding, thereby strengthening their employability and readiness for professional careers.

Service and Stewardship: Engaging NSS Activities for Community Development

Our college takes pride in actively promoting community engagement and social responsibility through its two NSS units during the academic year 2025–26. A total of 60 extension activities were organized in the neighbourhood for social and holistic development. These included medical camps, plantation drives, Clean & Green initiatives, voter awareness programmes, health awareness rallies, Anganwadi outreach activities, cancer awareness walkathons, environmental campaigns, rice donation programmes, village surveys, and various community service initiatives.

Activities Conducted by Various Clubs and Wings (2025–26)

Student development at **S.Ch.V.P.M.R. Government Degree College, Ganapavaram** is strengthened through the active functioning of several **clubs, cells, and student support units**, each guided by committed faculty coordinators. These platforms provide opportunities for students to participate in academic, cultural, social, and community-oriented programmes, thereby promoting leadership skills, social responsibility, and holistic personality development.

- The **Women Empowerment Cell (WEC)**, under the leadership of **Dr. Ch. Anuradha, Lecturer in English**, with the support of **Sri P. Balamanikanta, Lecturer in Commerce**, organized programmes aimed at promoting gender awareness, confidence, and leadership among girl students. During the academic year, the Cell conducted activities such as **International Women’s Day celebrations and an awareness programme on the International Day of the Girl Child**. The college also celebrated **Sankranthi Sambaralu on 09 January 2026**, a cultural programme that encouraged students to participate in traditional competitions and festivities. The event received generous support from **Sri K. A. V. Satyanarayana Raju, CPDC**

Secretary, who sponsored prizes for the participants, thereby encouraging student involvement in cultural activities.

- The **Youth Red Cross (YRC)** unit of the college, functioning under the guidance of **Sri Ch. Rajababu, Lecturer in English (Contract), Convener**, and supported by **Sri S. Venkanna Babu, Lecturer in Commerce (Guest Faculty)**, conducted programmes that enhanced students' awareness of social and public safety issues. During the year, the unit organized a **Cyber Crime Awareness Programme on 24 October 2025 in collaboration with the Ganapavaram Police Department**, helping students understand the risks associated with digital platforms and methods for online safety. - The **Red Ribbon Club**, coordinated by **Sri P. Through awareness campaigns and collaborative programmes with other student units, the club played a significant role in sensitizing students about health-related issues and the importance of preventive care.
